
Q1 How often do you attend teachings or other events?



Q2 What TNL offerings are you most likely to attend?



Q3 What do you consider to be your level of engagement with the Dharma?







Q6 Is TNL's space a comfortable place to learn and practice?





Q7 How far do you travel to come to events at TNL?





Q8 Do you attend events at TNL by yourself or with others?



Q9 Do you consider TNL to be your primary spiritual or religious "home"?



Q10 To what extent do you interact with people from TNL outside of the Center?



Q11 Do you feel TNL is welcoming to young families?





Q12 To what extent have you provided financial or other support to TNL?



Q13 Does TNL keep its community sufficiently informed about its finances?







Q17 What is your approximate age?


